

 - Villanova University Annual Security and Fire Safety Reports (2010 and 2013)







Murder, Manslaughter, and Weapons

- A single weapons violation occurred in 2007

Three Year Trends in Crime




Assault, Theft, and Drug Offenses for 2004, 2007-2012



Assault

- According to the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program:
 - Aggravated assault: an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury.
 - Simple Assault: an attack in which the victim did not sustain serious injuries



Assault


• In the years 2004 and 2005-2012, assaults (simple and aggravated) constituted less than .26% of all campus incidents

*Possibly affected by the way in which Villanova Public Safety categorizes alcohol-related offenses






Change in Categorization of Alcohol-Related Offenses?
